UPDATE ON WHITEY

As most of you are aware now, Matthew 'Whitey' Greig has had a bit of a tough time of late since breaking his leg against Blacktown. This is Whitey's first season with the Rams and he has been gearing up for a big year since we were at Woods Street. This is a bit blow for both Whitey and the Club. Below is a bit of a timeline for Whitey:

- Admitted to emergency at Westmead on Saturday. Advised his injury was a '36 hour' injury meaning it's best to be operated on within 36 hours. X-rays revealed top of his tibia was split in a 'Y' shape.
- Unfortunately as a broken leg is not considered life threatening, his surgery was pushed back twice until Wednesday midday.
- Surgery was a success for tibia, 15cm metal plate with 7 screws.
- During surgery it was discovered his meniscus is snapped & completely destroyed (will require more surgery).
- Post surgery, experienced agonising pain and fever for 36 hours.
- Friday: diagnosed with acute compartment syndrome after he lost movement and feeling in his toes. Received emergency surgery to relieve pressure built up in his leg from the swelling.
- Today (Monday): surgery again to clean the wound from the ACS surgery.

Going forward:

- More surgery on Wednesday to clean the wound from his ACS surgery.
- Will require a skin graft to cover the wound left from ACS surgery before being discharged from Hospital. If all goes well from here, he will be discharged early next week and back supporting the Rams from the sideline.

Please spare a thought for Whitey as he tries to work his way back to full health.

As a club, we support each other on and off the field. We are taking up a collection for Whitey. Please contribute at training and on game day.
